FAQ'S

Q: How is the process handled?

A: First we will come to assess the job and give the customer a FREE estimate. Then we will make a template of your counter that is used as a pattern for fabricating the stone. The template also lets us know how many slabs will be needed for the job. From there the customer will pick out stone from one of our samples or choose from a large selection of slabs at Meta Marble located in Seattle. Once the slab is chosen a 50% deposit must be put down in order to secure the slab(s). Next we take the stone to our fabrication shop to be made. After fabrication is complete we bring the tops to your house or place of business and install them. Then we return the next day to finish up caulking and sealing your tops. Once the job is complete the remaining balance is due within 30 days.

Q: How long will it take?

A: Each job is unique in size, type of stone chosen and edge detail. Therefore a timeline will be given to the customer once we have all of this information.

Q: What's an edge detail?

A: An edge detail is the side of the counter that hangs out just over your cabinets. It gets cut, ground and polished to the customers liking. Two examples of different edge details are a bull nose and an ease & polish (this is what all the club counters are done in)

Q: Isn't stone really expensive?

A: It doesn't have to be. Yes stone will cost more than a plastic laminate but there are two main variables that can change the price of the job. The first is the Type of stone chosen. Slabs can range anywhere from \$5 per sqft up to \$500 per sqft. Generally most slabs are in the \$10-\$30 per sqft range. The second key variable is the edge detail. For instance, the Bull nose is far more labor intensive than the ease & polish, therefore making it more expensive.

Q: What kind of stone should I use? Marble, Granite, Slate?

A: For certain applications, any type of stone can be chosen, but for others, like kitchen counters you want to use granite. This is because it's a much harder stone that won't get scratched by knives. It's also not as porous as marble, so it won't stain as easily.
